
ELCOME O ARKANSAS







Arkansas State University is home to one of the mid-South's finest museums, an arts center and an indoor sports/entertainment complex. The Crowley's Ridge National Scenic Byway leads to the Forrest L. Wood Crowley's Ridge Nature Center and runs along Craighead Forest Park, a much-loved city park on 692 acres. Groups can also venture out to explore Civil War routes, the Trail of Tears and the Southwest Trail. all part of the Arkansas Heritage Trails System in this area. Schedule a special expedition to tour Historic Dyess Colony and the Johnny Cash Boyhood Home.



West Memphis, Arkansas is a charming small town just across the Mississippi River from downtown Memphis, Tennessee. The Eugene Woods Civic Center can accommodate any group from 10 to 1000 with high quality AV, projection screens, and projectors. If your meeting guests are seeking entertainment, they can find fun, thrills and great eats at Southland Casino Racing, which offers over 2000 gaming machines, the World Market Buffet restaurant, live greyhound racing and simulcast horse and harness racing. In summer 2021, the casino will add a 20-story hotel tower with 300 rooms. This historic oil boomtown and world headquarters of Murphy Oil Corporation has struck big again with creation of the Murphy Arts District. The \$54 million renovation centers around the 1928 Griffin Building. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, it was a former Model T showroom that now houses the 2,000-seat Griffin Music Hall, a farm-to-table restaurant called The Griffin and a cabaret lounge. The Griffin Building overlooks the 8,000-capacity amphitheater, a two-acre children's playscape, and the farmers market next door.

In addition to the Arts District, El Dorado offers lodging, fine dining and a host of attractions like the South Arkansas Arts Center, South Arkansas Symphony and South Arkansas Arboretum State Park. Voted as having "America's Best Downtown" in 2009, El Dorado is rich in southern charm with plenty of culture and events to delight visitors. Sitting at the crossroads of four states, Texarkana is a natural meeting site for the whole region, located at the intersection of I-30 and I-49. You can straddle the state line and snap your own photo as you stand in two states at once! But there's so much more to Texarkana, which has outdoor recreation, culture and the arts, history, shopping or dining to entertain your meeting guests. If you want to host a special meeting or event, the Holiday Inn connects to the Arkansas Convention Center right next to the popular Holiday Springs waterpark. The Texarkana Country Club can seat up to 200 for dinner in its formal ballroom and offers luxury outdoor experiences. Attractions include the Four States Auto Museum and the Four States Fair and Rodeo. The Texarkana Regional Airport is building a new terminal in 2021, which will allow larger airplanes and more airlines for even greater ease of access.

ARKANSAS STATE PARK LODGES

ARKANSAS'S STATE PARK LODGES are

ideal sites for meetings, welcoming planners and guests to striking landscapes and spacious facilities serving delicious meals. The architects who designed the lodges at these parks built structures of wood and stone that harmonize with their natural settings, with magnificent walls of glass in lobbies and restaurants to showcase scenic views.

The state capitalized on its natural beauty by choosing remarkable locations. At **PETIT JEAN**, the state's first mountain resort park, guests can stay either in a 24-room lodge or in one of 33 cabins. MOUNT MAGAZINE'S RESORT offers a 60-room lodge and 13 cabins that stretch across a bluff on the state's highest mountain. At QUEEN WILHELMINA STATE PARK, the 40-room lodge perches on

Rich Mountain, the state's secondhighest peak. For those who prefer an island getaway, there's **DEGRAY** LAKE RESORT STATE PARK, featuring a 96-room lodge that faces the clear and tranguil lake.



Two unique twists on traditional state park resorts are the state's mountain cultural center and a historic bed-and-breakfast. OZARK FOLK CENTER celebrates cultural exploration, with live music, a craft center where 20 artisans work, and gardens that offer fresh produce for its restaurant. This park welcomes overnight guests in 60 duplex-style rooms with a friendly village feel. THE JAILHOUSE BED AND **BREAKFAST** at Historic Washington State Park surrounds visitors with living history in a 1918 jailhouse, now renovated with eight guest rooms with charm and all modern amenities. The Jailhouse is part of a full historic village including the 1832 Williams Tavern restaurant.





Each park has meeting spaces of varying sizes and styles. DeGray attracts large groups with a convention center for 300. Mount Magazine and Ozark Folk Center have flexible spaces for under 200 people. The Jailhouse offers ample meeting space for up to 250 in the surrounding historic village, including an auditorium, meeting rooms and a large WPA gym. Queen Wilhelmina's 75-person meeting room has the bonus of a balcony with mountain views. Petit Jean's smaller meeting rooms are perfect for retreats and board meetings.

As resorts, the parks pack in plenty of amenities that may include mountain trails for hiking, pools for swimming, and lakes for fishing, boating and water sports. Guests can enjoy bicycles, horseback riding and outdoor pavilions. DeGray has a championship golf course, a disc golf course and a marina for boat rentals.

No two menus are alike at any of the parks' full-service restaurants. Diners will find surprises like lamb souvlaki or spring duck salad alongside more traditional fare. All of the restaurants offer catering services, using farm-to-table ingredients from local producers as much as possible.
